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- VI. About studying and working abroad to obtain German Studies credit:
(1) a new summer studies program has been developed in Trier; (2) the Office of International Programs also administers exchanges for a semester or a year at 20 study sites in Germany or Austria; (3) Appalachian has a direct exchange program with Universitaet Trier and with die Paedagogische Hochschule in Karlsruhe. Students are advised to take classes abroad which parallel courses in the existing German Studies program to ensure maximal transfer credit.
