

I. CORE CURRICULUM 44

Courses totaling 29 semester hours must be completed in addition to the 15 semester hours of courses required for the major that will also meet core curriculum requirements (CHE 1101, 1110, 1102, 1120 and MAT 1110). Must complete ENG 1000 and 1100, HIS 1101 and 1102, 12 semester hours of humanities (courses must be from three different areas, including one literature course and one fine arts course), 6 semester hours of social science courses selected from two different areas and 2 semester hours of physical activity/wellness courses.

Recommended humanities course: P&R 1100, Logic I (3 semester hours)
