

I. CORE CURRICULUM.....44

Nine hours of English major courses can meet humanities requirement of twelve hours; six hours of literature AND either English 2170 or Foreign Language 1040 or 1050 (or 1060) (also required to complete Foreign Language). The remaining three hours must be a fine arts. THR 2610 will meet the fine arts requirement.

2.0 major GPA is required for graduation. Major GPA calculation will include all courses taken in the major department, plus any other courses under III. No more than 40 semester hours of courses in English may be counted toward the BA Degree.

36 semester hours above the freshman level; 24 semester hours must be at the 3000 level or above.

English Major with Creative Writing Concentration. There is no penalty if a student is unable or unwilling to complete the requirements for the concentration; all courses successfully completed for the concentration, including Theatre 2610, can still be counted toward fulfilling requirements for the B.A. in English. Each student concentrating in Creative Writing will take 15-21 semester hours from the following courses as partial fulfillment of requirements for the B.A. in English:
